Course Outline/ Course Objectives

Course Outline: To help students learn how to write biomedical research papers in English, and to give them exposure to global health, disease, and medical issues through a firm introduction to medical anthropology. There will be some required readings and a writing assignment. Students will be required to prepare and execute a short academic presentation on the last day of class. There is no need for students to purchase a textbook. The exact contents of, and plan for, the course will be decided on the first class day, as these will depend on the students' English abilities and on their specific needs.

Course Objectives: By the end of the course, students should have a fuller understanding of the relations between culture and health, disease and healing, be better able to consider healthcare from a critical perspective, and be better prepared to present research findings in English – orally and in writing.
